- ENTRY FORMS: Please complete all online entries for exhibits early. The office will be open Monday to Friday starting Monday September 15, 2025, from 9:00am 4:00pm daily.

- ENTRY TAGS: You may pick up your entry tags at the office ahead of time. If not, they will be available Wed. Sept 24<sup>th</sup> until 8:30pm or Thurs Sept 25<sup>th</sup> until 10am.
- <u>EXHIBITS</u>: Bring your exhibits (with attached entry tag) to Hall #1 on Wed. Sept 24<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 pm 9:00 pm or Thurs. Sept 25<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am -10:30am.
- **JUDGING:** The halls will be closed at 10:30am and judging will commence at 11:00 am.
- **<u>PICK UP:</u>** Exhibits MUST remain in the halls until closing Sunday, September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Halls close at 4:00 pm. Pick-up will begin at 5:00 pm and close at 6:00 pm.

All exhibits must be removed between 5:00 pm and 6:00 pm Sunday, September 28th. Halls close promptly at 6:00 pm. The Halton Agricultural Society is not responsible for exhibits not picked up by 6:00 pm. You must present your exhibitor pass in order to pick up your entry.

## **Rules & Regulations:**

Tarts must be on a clean paper plate inside a clear plastic bag. Entry must be made solely by the person entering the competition including the pastry. Winner will represent Milton Fair at the District Competition in October 2025. Prize money in Section 31 is 1<sup>st</sup> - \$15, 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$10 and 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$8.

## District Competition (October 2025)

A total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, mailing address and fair represented.

The size of the tarts must be full size tarts. (no mini or bite size tarts) and must not contain fruit or nuts (ie. no raisins, no pecans).

If the exhibitor has won at more than one fair, the one closest to the exhibitor's home address is the agricultural society from which the entry will be sent to the district competition. An exhibitor may only enter into one district completion. Prize money to be paid by the District. First place will represent District 5 at the Provincial Competition.

# Provincial Competition (February 2026)

The entrant must have won the District Competition to be eligible to enter the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Competition at the convention. In the case where the District winner is unable to send an entry to the convention then the 2nd prize district winner will be eligible to enter.

A total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, mailing address and district represented.

The size of the tarts must be full size tarts. (no mini or bite size tarts) and must not contain fruit or nuts (ie. no raisins, no pecans).

1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place entries will not be returned to exhibitor but will be placed for auction at the convention.
