- **ENTRY TAGS:** You may pick up your entry tags at the office ahead of time. If not, they will be available Wed. Sept 24<sup>th</sup> until 8:30pm or Thurs Sept 25<sup>th</sup> until 10am.
- **EXHIBITS:** Bring your exhibits (with attached entry tag) to under the Grandstand on Wed. Sept 24<sup>th</sup> from 3:00 pm - 9:00 pm or Thurs. Sept 25<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am -10:30am.
- **JUDGING:** The halls will be closed at 10:30am and judging will commence at 11:00 am.
- **PICK UP:** Exhibits MUST remain in the halls until closing Sunday, September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Halls close at 4:00 pm. Pick-up will begin at 5:00 pm and close at 6:00 pm.
