- **ENTRY FORMS:** Please complete all online entries for exhibits early. The office will be open Monday to Friday starting Monday September 15, 2025, from 9:00am – 4:00pm daily.
- **ENTRY SUBMISSION:** Entries MUST be submitted online *prior* to Friday Sept. 19th at 4:00pm to receive an entry number. If you need assistance, you can contact the office for help via E-mail office@miltonfair.com or phone: 905-878-5689
- **ENTRY TAGS:** You may pick up your entry tags at the office ahead of time. If not, they will be available Wed. Sept 24th until 8:30pm or Thurs Sept 25th until 10am.
- **EXHIBITS:** Bring your exhibits (with attached entry tag) to under the Grandstand on Wed. Sept 24th from 6:00 pm - 9:00 pm or Thurs. Sept 25th from 9:00 am -10:30am.
- **JUDGING:** The halls will be closed at 10:30am and judging will commence at 11:00 am.
- **PICK UP:** Exhibits MUST remain in the halls until closing Sunday, September 28th, 2025. Halls close at 4:00 pm. Pick-up will begin at 5:00 pm and close at 6:00 pm.

The Halton Agricultural Society is not responsible for exhibits not picked up by 6:00 pm. Halls close promptly at 6:00 pm. You must present your hall pass in order to pick up your entry.

NOTE: This entire class is registered as Children's.
Children's prize money and exhibits are to be picked up on Sunday, September 28th, 2025, at 5:00 pm upon presentation of stamped exhibitor pass. The Halton Agricultural Society is not responsible for exhibits not picked up by 6:00 pm.
